

Summer Uniform – Reminder!

It was wonderful to see all the children returning on Tuesday morning in their summer uniforms with some lovely new, crisp white polo shirts on display. By the end of the week almost 100% of children were in correct and approved summer uniform – thank you! Nobody should now be wearing a school tie and collared shirt (winter uniform), but following the school uniform guidance clearly displayed in your child's homework diary. We have had to mention to a number of boys about the colour of their socks – these must be black or grey only (NOT white or patterned).

Can I also remind you that girls who wear hairbands/clips..etc. must wear them in the approved school colours and they must be of a size that they do not become a distraction or hinderance to themselves or others. Children with long hair are also required to have this tied back and away from their face. We expect our school uniform to reflect our high expectations across the school and we thank you for your support in this matter. As we notice children wearing incorrect uniform they will get a reminder sticker placed in their homework diary.

School Crossing Patrol Service

Please read the following safety message on behalf of the School Crossing Patrol Service:

<u>Pedestrians</u> – Would pedestrians please refrain from crossing Sawyers Hall Lane from the corner of Highlands Avenue and before they arrive at the crossing site to cross with the patrols assistance. Crossing between waiting cars is very dangerous and especially for the unaccompanied children who are following the adults who cross before they get to the patrol. For the safety of everyone please always cross with the patrol – thank you.

Drivers in cars that are stationary focus their attention on waiting for the vehicle in front to move and are not expecting pedestrians to approach from the sides of their vehicles when they are queuing. This practise can cause accidents. This also makes the role of the patrol more difficult as the patrol should only have to

worry about pedestrians at the crossing site. Whilst pedestrians are still weaving bewteen waiting cars, they are unable to release the traffic which then causes other unsafe practises. For safety, please cross with the patrol at the designated crossing site as this will enable traffic to pass the crossing site more quickly.

<u>Drivers</u> – Drivers must stop attempting to overtake vehicles who have stopped for the crossing patrol. Vehicles are then on the wrong side of the road when traffic is released causing gridlock and further delays and puts the crossing patrol in danger. Thank you.

Our weekly class-based Eucharists have really given all our children an opportunity to explore, question and become confident with the sacrament of the Mass and I think this is a key factor in seeing so many children wanting to be confirmed.

These candidates are now preparing to be confirmed at St Thomas of Canterbury Church on Sunday 9th July 2023 and will receive the sacrament of confirmation from Bishop Norman, the Bishop of Richborough. Over the coming weeks these children will continue to complete confirmation preparation classes with Fr. Mark and revisit their baptismal promises and understanding of their faith. I hope you will be able to pray for these children and their families at this very special time.

Coronation Celebrations for King Charles III

The Coronation of Charles III and his wife, Camilla, as King and Queen of the United Kingdom and the other Commonwealth realms will take place on Saturday 6th May 2023, at Westminster Abbey and will be conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury. Charles acceded to the throne on 8th September 2022, upon the death of his mother, Queen Elizabeth II. The Coronation will reflect the monarch's role today and look towards the future, while being rooted in longstanding traditions and pageantry.

To commemorate this historic event we are asking all the children and staff to wear red, white and blue clothing to school on **Friday 5th May 2023**. Over the course of the day we will be exploring the significance of the events taking place over the Coronation weekend, and in the afternoon we will be bringing all the children from both the Infant and Junior Schools together to take part in some activities in mixed age groups in and around the school premises. This will also involve a simple act of collective worship with the singing of the National Anthem and prayers.

We are praying for fine weather on this day so we can also make use of our school grounds to allow all the children from both schools a chance to play and socialise with each other. We will also be making sure that each child has a special Coronation cake to eat made by our own catering team. Please start searching out your red, white and blue items so we can be really patriotic!!
